## **ACTIVITY BADGES**

#### Activity Badge Title:

1. What's in a Name?

#### Badge Description

Valentine's Day has its origins in ancient Rome, where one legend suggests that a priest named Valentine helped to marry young couples in secret. Later, the holiday became romanticized by the writings of Shakespeare and Chaucer. During this time, the tradition of sharing homemade paper cards began, eventually leading to the familiar pink, red, and sparkly valentines we know today.

## Activity

• Grab your favorite craft supplies (think construction paper, colored pencils, glue, glitter, etc.) and create your own valentine! Use scissors to cut out paper hearts, write a poem to someone you're grateful for, or just create something fun and sparkly.

#### Activity Badge Title:

2. A Rose by Any Other Name

#### **Badge Description**

During the 17th century in Europe, King Charles II of Sweden created "the language of flowers." Different flowers took on different meanings and led to the tradition of giving flowers on Valentine's Day. The rose, associated with the Greek goddess Aphrodite, became the ultimate symbol of love on this day.

### Activity

• Personification means giving human characteristics to something nonhuman. Write a short poem from the perspective of a flower! What kind of flower are you? What do you smell like? Where are you? Are you around other flowers like you, or in a beautiful mixed bouquet? What is your favorite thing to do? Use your imagination and have fun!

## Activity Badge Title:

3. True Beauty

#### Badge Description

Celebrate the love you have for yourself! Think about all of the wonderful things you have to offer, and know that even if you have a bad day, you're still worthy of love. Just as you would show someone else kindness, be sure to show yourself kindness too.

#### Activity

It's easy to get down on ourselves when we make a mistake or feel upset. Make a list of 10 things you love about yourself. Include personality traits (like "I am kind"), things you're good at (like "I'm good at baking"), or things you're proud of (like "I read 10 books last year!"). Keep your list somewhere you can see it in case you ever need a reminder of why you're AWESOME.

#### Activity Badge Title:

4. Star-Crossed

#### Badge Description

Take a moment to think about the people in your life who you love and who love you. Express your gratitude to those you care about any day of the year. Love really does make the world go round!

### Activity

• Decorate a box or jar, fill it with love notes for someone you care about, and give the box to that person. Every time they need a little extra love, they can pick out a note made especially for them, from you! Include things you are grateful for or love about this person, like "My favorite memory of you is\_\_\_\_\_" or "I'm proud of you because\_\_\_\_\_."
