First stop on the worldwide winter tour: Harbin, China! From the end of December to early March, this town goes all out to celebrate ice and snow. In fact, artists build enormous sculptures out of snow and ice—including entire buildings. Visitors can cross ice bridges and climb ice stairs. They can even view entire castles and palaces made of ice.

But that's not all—for people wanting more, there are ice hotels located around the world. That's right: people can stay overnight in buildings created entirely from ice. Some, like the

In 2022, the mayor of New York City arrived in Central Park to celebrate the lighting of a menorah. A menorah is a candelabra that holds nine candles. During the Jewish holiday of Hanukkah, one candle is lit each night along with the central candle. So, what was so different about this menorah? Its size! This menorah is the largest one in the entire world. It stretches 36 feet (11 m) high. That's almost as tall as a four-story building.

They then decorate these trees with lights and ornaments. In India, however, it is too warm for these trees to grow. Instead, people place their decorations on mango trees, which grow in

many places. Thousands of miles away in Ukraine, there are plenty of fir and pine trees. However, the way people decorate these trees is unique. In Ukraine, one legend tells the tale of a Christmas spider who helped bring good luck and money to a poor family by spinning her webs over a Christmas tree. The webs then magically turned into gold! Because of this, it is thought to be good luck to have spiderwebs on your Christmas tree in Ukraine. Many people place ornaments designed to look like webs on the tree—or, if they are lucky, a spider might spin a real one!
