

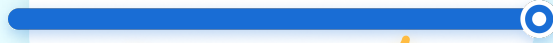

Set a Community Reading Goal

- Beanstack allows educators to [set a community reading goal](#) that everyone in your school or district contributes to.
- Use our simple formulas to set a goal that shows progress quickly, striking a balance between achievable and ambitious:
 - School year goal = student population x 100 minutes
 - Shorter time frame goals = student population x 10 minutes per month
- Don't forget to celebrate your progress! Find [resources](#) for promoting your goal, like morning announcement scripts and a thermometer poster.

Our data shows that students logged double the reading minutes on Beanstack sites with a goal compared to sites without a goal.
