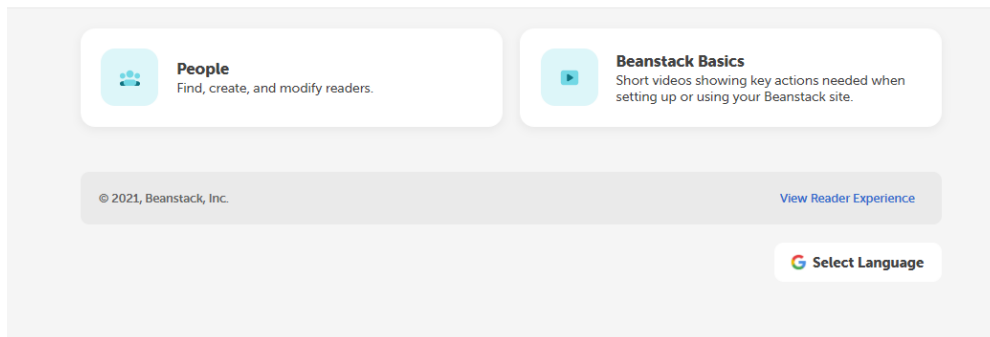




Beanstack Staff Training

Beanstack Quick Reference Guide for Staff:

Registering on Beanstack

1. Click on the Beanstack registration link - <https://kinglibrary.beanstack.org/>
2. Click "Register an Individual or Family"
 - a. One account can be created for an entire family
3. The registration process will ask for the Account Creator's (parent's) information first, then the child's information.
 - a. There will be one login and password
 - b. The parent becomes the "Account Creator" with kids listed as readers under them

4. Once the person has registered everyone for Beanstack they will be placed in one of the reader's Beanstack pages. They will then register for the summer reading programs for each reader
 - a. Change reader by clicking the drop-down menu in the top left
 - b. Young kids can register to be part of the **1000 Books Before Kindergarten Program** and the **Summer Reading Challenge** at the same time
 - i. Each book read can be counted towards both challenges
 - c. Summer Reading Challenges are divided up by age - however, children on the edge can choose whether they want to be aged up or down based on theirs and their parents' preference.
5. Patrons may also register as an individual. Follow the prompts in the form to register the reader.

Registering with a Previous Account

To be used if patrons need help joining a reading challenge but they already have a Beanstack account.

1. Staff should log in to Beanstack and go to the People tab
2. Click on *Find a Person*
3. Type in first and last name or email address
4. Click *search*
5. Choose the correct name from the list under the **Reader** column
6. This will show a list of available reading challenges for that reader
7. Find the right challenge
8. Click the box under "Enrolled"? A green checkmark will appear

Register an Offline Reader

Offline readers are perfect for tracking the progress of people who will never log in themselves (i.e. users participating exclusively using paper). These readers will be represented in reports and insights but will not be able to ever sign into Beanstack.

1. Log into Beanstack with a staff account
2. Click on people
3. Add Offline Reader

4. Fill out all fields with a * and if possible other fields as well

7. Patrons will bring paper logs to the library and staff will input them into Beanstack for each patron

Earning Badges

1. Depending on the challenge badges can be earned for logging reading (either a number of books or minutes), writing a review or completing an activity
2. This can be done on the app or on the web by the patron
 - a. Select the reader that the patron wants to log for
 - b. They can then select *Log* and earn all badges available to them and that has been completed
3. To do this for a patron:
 - a. Log into Beanstack on the staff account
 - b. Search for the patron
 - c. Choose the correct reader



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- d. To the right of the reader's name you can choose an action
 - i. To edit a reader (contact info etc) choose the pencil
 - ii. To redeem a prize choose the ballot box

- iii. To add to the log choose the paper with the plus sign

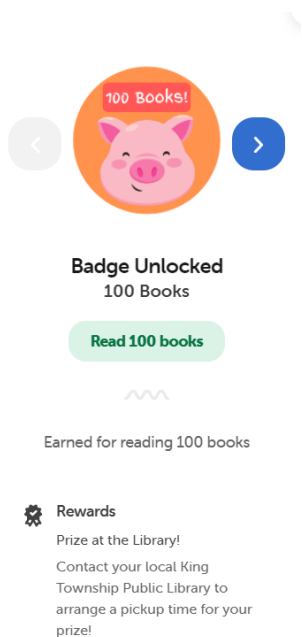

Awarding and Giving Prizes

1000 Books Before Kindergarten

Patrons will earn badges for every 25 books read. At the 100 level (100, 200, 300, etc.) they will be notified to let us know they have reached this milestone. We can then prepare the appropriate prize for them to pick up.



Once the prize has been picked up mark them as having received their prize on Beanstack.

Be sure to fill out the prize log

Summer Reading Club

Patrons will automatically be enrolled in the applicable prize draws for their reading challenge. For the under 18 reading challenges, we will do a prize draw every 2nd week. Each badge earned is an entry into the prize draw, so the more patrons track their reading, write reviews and complete activities the more chances they have to win!

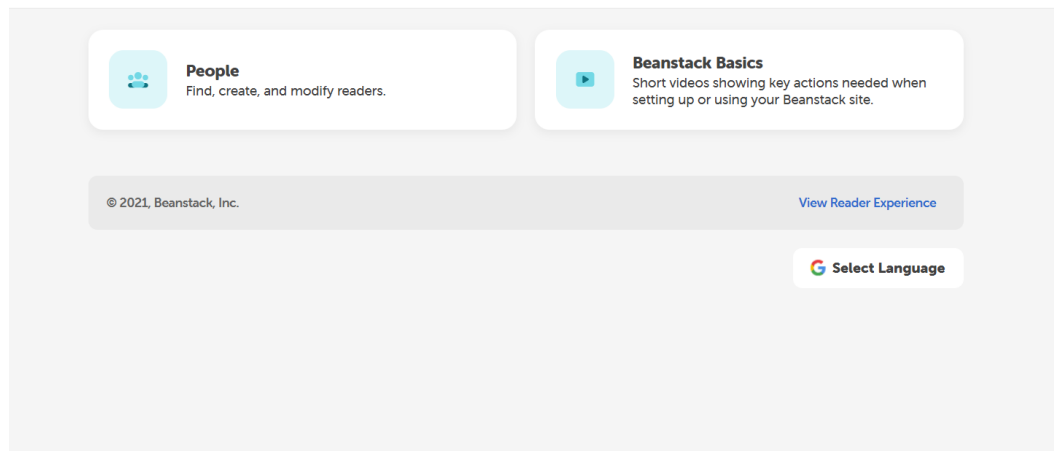
If a patron has won a prize it will show up on their Beanstack account. Please be sure to log in and mark that the patron has received their prize!

Prize Redemption

If a patron says they have reached a prize milestone (**1000 Books Before Kindergarten**) or won a prize you can do a quick check on Beanstack.

1. Log into Beanstack using the staff login
2. Ensure you are in the *Administrative Access* and not the *Reader Experience* view

Difference Between “Account Creator” and “Reader”

- A patron can be an Account Creator AND a Reader, if they have their own profile, are participating in the reading challenge
- For example, *Reader A* has an account and is logging reading, so she is an Account Creator AND a Reader
