Summary

This book is called Animals in the Hot Desert. It shows animals that live in the desert. Read the book to find out what lives in the desert.

Before Reading

- Read the title of the book and the book's summary.
- Have students look through the book and make predictions and connections using the photographs.
- Introduce new vocabulary and unfamiliar concepts.
- Ask students what letter they would expect to see at the beginning of a high-frequency word, such as long. Invite students to find that word in the book.



After Reading

Ask students questions about the book and the book's topic:

- 1. What animals live in the desert?
- 2. Why do you think these animals live in the desert?
- 3. Have you ever been to a desert or seen pictures of one? What did you see there?

Word Study


High-Frequency Word Practice

Teacher directions: Give each student a whiteboard and dry-erase marker. Have students practice writing the words "in," "long," and "the." Have students say each word as they write it.

Elkonin Sound Boxes

Teacher directions:

- Have students draw three squares on a sheet of paper, chalkboard, or whiteboard.
- Give each student three counting chips or cubes. Have students place a counter below each square.



- 3. Say a word aloud, stretching it into sound segments. For example, /o/ /w/ /l/
- 4. Have students say the blended word.
- 5. Say the segmented word again. This time, ask students to listen to the sounds in the word. Model the action of sliding a counter into a square as you say each sound in the word.
- Invite students to slide the counters from left to right as they say each sound in the word.
